Housing critical for fresh start

Nancy was ready to turn her life around.

With the support of an FTP counsellor, she developed a plan for upgrading her education, hoping to get a job that could pay enough to support herself and her two children.



Nancy took part in counselling and was rebuilding her confidence and self esteem after years of putdowns and intimidation from her parents, and then her husband.

"My stay here gave me time to prepare to move on."

What Nancy needed, and found at FTP, was an affordable place to stay as well as support from someone who could help her stay on track as she turned her life plan into reality.

FTP's Outreach Services (which includes Second Stage Housing, Transitional/Legal Support) are options for Dufferin and Caledon abused women and their children who need practical support while getting back on their feet.

Through Outreach Services, women receive housing, transitional and legal support to:

- identify long and short term goals for taking the practical steps to independence
- develop safety and transitional plans
- connect with other community agencies for housing, parenting, legal advice, income assistance, education, training, and health and wellness services

Women interested in Second Stage Housing :

- may apply for a transitional housing stay of up to six months
- can apply without having stayed in the emergency shelter
- pay monthly rent based on their income
- share the home with other women and their children
- are responsible for housekeeping
